Discussion about delivery access and parking were also brought up as trouble points. Currently the city is taking bids to find a contractor for this project.

Presentation 2: Craig Clark: (Arrow Sanitary)

Arrow Sanitary Company is a Residential hauler for recycling and trash services. Recycling for businesses and residential are pretty similar with which item should go into which bin. Christmas foil is not recyclable nor is any cards made with foil. To go compostable containers from restaurants are actually trash due to the time it takes to break them down. Batteries, light bulbs, and batteries METRO website can help with recycling them. Bio Hazard like tube florescent lighting Total Reclaim can help with recycling.
